- A reminder about the Wreaths Across America program for national cemeteries. This organization provides wreaths to be place at the headstones of all veterans buried in National Cemeteries across the United States. You can sponsor a wreath for a specific person in a National Cemetery, or simply sponsor a wreath for anyone in any national cemetery. We are planning a group trip to Florida National Cemetery in Bushnell to lay the wreaths. This will be on December 18, from 11:30 until the wreaths are laid. If you are interested in going with us, please let me know. This is open to all, not just Suddenly One members, so if you know of someone who might be interested, please tell me. I'm attaching a flyer explaining more about this. I will give more details about our trip as it gets closer.
- We discussed ideas for a group outing at least once a month that is separate from the usual meeting. This will give us more of an opportunity to socialize with each other and maybe explore more of our area. Not everyone will be able to attend every outing, but we'll try to make it as convenient as possible for everyone to get a chance to do something. Some of the suggestions made at this meeting included the Butterfly Exhibit in Gainesville, a riverboat ride in Dunnellon or at Silver Springs, or a visit to the Gypsy Vanner horse farm. Some of our members have volunteered to drive others to medical procedures, make calls or send cards to people feeling low, or making services available at no cost to members (such as notarizing documents).
